During the next seven weeks, we will be reading 'Macbeth' by William Shakespeare. We will focus on the characters of Macbeth and Lady Macbeth and how they are driven by ambition to take dramatic action. Furthermore, we will look at how Shakespeare used particular writer's methods to influence readers. We will also explore the context in which the play was written and how that also influenced Shakespeare's writing.
