



# Summer Learning Journey for English

## How does this unit link to prior learning?

This year, we have explored a range of different fiction and non-fiction texts to develop our own reading and writing skills. These texts include the exploration of 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night' to develop our analysis skills as well as exploration of gothic poetry and gothic creative writing to develop our own creative writing.

## What will you be learning about?

This half term we will be using the reading and writing skills we have developed this year to complete our end of term exam. We will also explore relationships through our CPD lessons and look to develop our oracy skills as we complete our spoken language assessment for GCSE English Language.

## We will develop our learning each week by focusing on:

### Week 1 Key Learning

- Retrieval Knowledge: Knowledge of the skills required to be successful for the reading questions of language paper one.
- Knowledge: Know the different skills needed in order to be successful including identification, analysis and evaluation

AO2: Explain, comment on and analyse how writers use language and structure to achieve effects, using writer's methods to support their views.  
AO4: Evaluate texts critically and support this with appropriate quotes from the text.
