Reformations and its links to conflict and civil war during the Stuart period.

##### Year 10

Early Elizabethan England will require students to understand the reformation and religious divisions and how these caused problems during Elizabeth's reign.

<p><b>EQ: What were the problems with the Catholic Church?</b></p> <p><b>Martin Luther:</b> German priest and theologian.  <b>Reformation:</b> reforming the catholic church and creating a new protestant church.  <b>Indulgence:</b> a pardon for sin committed.  <b>Vernacular:</b> in the language of the local people.  <b>Protestant:</b> reformed version of Christianity.  <b>Transubstantiation:</b> belief that the wine and wafer used during communication is transformed into the body and blood of Jesus Christ.  <b>Clergy:</b> name for workers in the church e.g. bishops and priests.</p>	<p><b>EQ: Did Mary I deserve the title 'bloody Mary'?</b></p> <p><b>Counter reformation:</b> catholic church tried to reform itself because of the reformation. They wanted to spread Catholicism.  <b>Marian persecutions:</b> period of executions of protestants.  <b>Burning at the stake:</b> from of executions where a person was executed by being tied  .</p>
<p><b>EQ: Why did Henry fall out with the Pope?</b></p> <p><b>Heir:</b> a person who inherits the right to land or a position such as monarch.  <b>Catherine of Aragon:</b> Henry VIII first wife who was a princess of Spain.  Prince Arthur: Henry VIII older brother who was married to Catherine of Aragon.  <b>Pope:</b> Head of the catholic church.  <b>Anne Boleyn:</b> Henry VIII second wife who he married while his first wife was alive.  <b>Annulment:</b> dissolving or cancelling a marriage which was not lawful.</p>	<p><b>EQ: How fair was Elizabeth's religious settlement?</b></p> <p><b>Settlement:</b> Elizabeth's attempt to restore Protestantism but keep some aspects of Catholicism.  <b>Act of Supremacy:</b> law that made Elizabeth Supreme governor of the Church of England.  <b>Act of uniformity:</b> law that made clear how religious services should be conducted.</p>
<p><b>EQ: Who were the winners and losers of the Reformation?</b></p> <p><b>Clergy:</b> name for workers in the church e.g. bishops and priests.  <b>Monasteries:</b> a religious house where monks lived.  <b>Dissolution of the Monasteries:</b> Closing down religious houses.</p>	<p><b>EQ: When was Elizabeth most in danger?</b></p> <p><b>Plot:</b> Plan to rebel.  <b>Rebellion:</b> plot put into action to overthrow the government.  <b>Excommunication:</b> excluding a person from taking part in church services.  <b>Papal Bull:</b> an official order from the pope.</p>
<p><b>EQ: What can sources tell us about the reformation?</b></p> <p><b>Usefulness:</b> What does the source tell you?  <b>Provenance:</b> Who wrote the source, when &amp; why? Does that effect its trustworthiness?</p>	<p><b>EQ: Did the English defeat the Armada by luck or skill?</b></p> <p><b>Armada:</b> a fleet of Warships  <b>Duke of Medina Sidonia:</b> Spanish leader of the Armada.  Lord Howard: Commander of the English forces.  <b>Francis Drake:</b> one of the leader of the English forces.  <b>Crescent:</b> half-moon/ semi-circle shape made by the Spanish armada.</p>
