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What will you be learning about?

In this unit students will be looking at arguments for and against the existence of God.

These will include famous theological and philosophical arguments such as the Teleological and cosmological argument.

We will look at famous Philosopher's arguments both for and against the existence of God and how this is one of the biggest questions to face humanity.

We will question: Does God exist? If so, what is he like? Why does he not get involved in society? Why does he not help solve evil and suffering.

Key Focus: The key skill will be evaluation. We will be looking at religious and nonreligious viewpoints, analysing why they have these views and begin to develop your own viewpoint.

We will develop our learning by studying the following each week:

To explain why someone might believe or disbelieve in the existence of God.
