What will you be learning about?

In this scheme of work, you will explore the concept of crime and punishment. We will consider what might influence individuals to commit crime and the punishments they will receive if they decide to commit this. We will consider issues including capital punishment, the treatment of criminals and forgiveness.

Religious beliefs such as Christianity will be examined, and how they want to support criminals to change their lives.

Key Focus: The key skill for this unit will be Evaluation. We will be looking at religious and nonreligious viewpoints, analysing why they have these views and then start to develop your viewpoint.

We will develop our learning by studying the following each week:

To understand what crime is. To understand why criminals, deserve to face justice for their actions.

Lesson 2: Attitudes to Crime

To understand the different attitudes to crime that individuals have and how this can change their lives.

To understand what the Death penalty is and begin to consider arguments both for and against it.

To understand what the Death penalty is. To evaluate arguments both for and against the death penalty.

To understand what forgiveness is and why it is important to some Christians.
