Section 1: Our School and Policy Aims and Objectives

Our School Context

Lode Heath School is a large co-educational secondary academy in Solihull for students aged 11-16. We provide a broad and inclusive curriculum and uphold the highest standards of academic excellence and behaviour. Our ethos is rooted in kindness, respect and aspiration, and we expect our students to treat others as they would wish to be treated. We encourage active participation in school life, including extra-curricular activities, and we promote the message: "Do something, be involved."

Aims

Our Accessibility Plan aims to ensure that Lode Heath School continues to make all reasonable adjustments to remove barriers for students, staff and visitors with disabilities. We aim to ensure equal access to all aspects of school life: curriculum, environment and information.

Objectives

- To increase the extent to which disabled students can participate in the school curriculum.
- To improve the physical environment to enable better access for disabled individuals.
- To improve the availability and accessibility of information for disabled students, parents, staff and visitors.

Section 2: Our Student Community

School and Pupil Data Analysis

Current pupil data shows that in January 2025 there were 182 pupils regarded as disabled under the definition within the Equality Act 2010. Pupil data is collated according to primary area of need, but for some pupils this is more challenging as they have co-existing conditions or areas of need.

What the data tells us

The number of students with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) at our school grew from 0.9% in 2024 to 1.2% in 2025. This is still 1.9% lower than the national average for secondary schools. Meanwhile, 14.5% of our students receive SEN Support, which is 1.1% higher than in other secondary schools across the country. The most common type of need is Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), followed by Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs, and then Specific Learning Difficulties (SpLD). We also have more students with ASD than the national average.

Section 3: Consultation with Stakeholders

This Accessibility Plan was developed in consultation with the school's leadership team, SENCO, site manager, parents, governors and students with disabilities. Their input was gathered via audits, student voice activities, staff training evaluations and parental feedback mechanisms.

The consultation process involved:

- Review of the 2022 accessibility audit
- Parent and student feedback via annual review meetings and EHCP consultations
- Staff feedback through CPD evaluations and line management structures
- Regular liaison with external professionals and the Local Authority

Section 4: Good Practice in School

Access to the Curriculum

At Lode Heath School, we strive to enable access to the curriculum for pupils with a disability. The following statements outline the range of strategies we use to help achieve this:

- All teachers receive ongoing CPD in inclusive practice and are expected to plan with differentiation and personalisation in mind.
- Specialist interventions are provided, including nurture groups and 1:1 support.
- Students benefit from visual timetables, overlays, learning scaffolds, and access to assistive technology.
- Staff work closely with external agencies and follow individual student passports and EHCPs.

Pupils are supported to access the benefits, services and facilities as part of the wider curriculum offered by the school.

Access to the Physical Environment

At Lode Heath School, we strive to enable access to the physical environment for pupils with a disability. The following statements outline the range of strategies we use to help achieve this:

- The school has four accessible toilets, disabled parking bays, ramps, and lifts in the main building.
- Classrooms are equipped with high-contrast lighting, acoustic dampening (carpeted floors), and blinds to support sensory needs.
- Annual audits inform capital improvements, such as signage, doors and stair access.
- Adjustments are made for individuals, including ergonomic furniture, stair lifts, and taxi drop-off access

Access to Information

At Lode Heath School, we strive to enable access to information for pupils with a disability. The following statements outline the range of strategies we use to help achieve this:

- Key information is available in large print, coloured backgrounds, or digital formats as needed.
- Students use overlays, reading pens, iPads and laptops to support their access to learning.
- The website is compliant with accessibility standards, although further improvement is planned for increased user-friendliness.
- Staff are trained to communicate accessibly with students and parents, and alternative formats are available on request.
